Man of Month

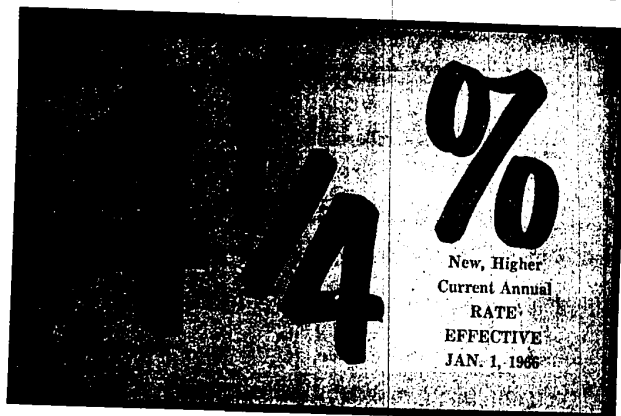
