Jehovah's Witnesses Assemble
 Over 200 Jehovah's witnesses and visitors assembled at Detroit's Cody High School to hear the discourse, "What Does the Resurrection of the Dead Mean to You and Yours?"
 According to J. W. Wilson, special representative of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society, billions of persons now dead and buried are resurrected to life here on earth. Speaking to a packed auditorium he said, "The resurrection of the dead is a central doctrine of the Bible, confirmed by the testimony of Jesus from the dead."
 Wilson further stated, "The Bible is unique in that it is the only book for religion teaching a resurrection." Drawing on the apostolic words at Acts 24:14, he advanced proof that both "righteous and unrighteous" ones will benefit from a raising of the dead.
 "THINK OF WHAT this will mean to the living survivors of friends and relatives. Think of the overall benefits to mankind which will have the inventive minds and musical talents of past masters revived through the resurrection," declared Wilson.
