Higher Petition

Per Cent Proposed

A change in the Farmington City Code requiring a greater number of petition signers against proposed rezoning to make it mandatory for 75 per cent approval by the City Council has been recommended by the City Planning Commission.

Presently the code specifies only 50 per cent but the planners feel a 75 per cent requirement would be more equitable. Action on the recommendation of Attorney Robert Kelly, the Council Monday night delayed action pending a study of state statutes on this matter.
