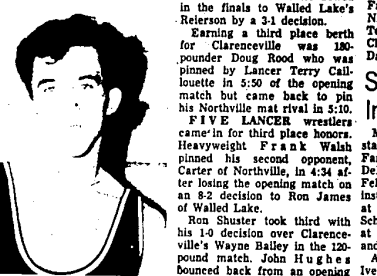

OLS Wrestlers Host Quadrangular Meet

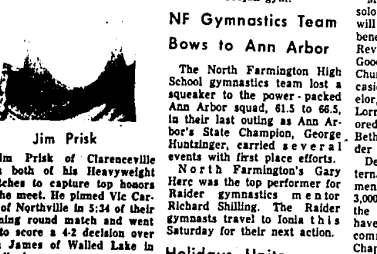
A quadrangular wrestling meet staged at Our Lady of Sorrows High School last Saturday brought together some of the finest area matmen in a test which could well forecast things to come in Regional and State tournaments.

The winner of the meet, Walled Lake, showed its awesome team power by sweeping six of the 12 weight divisions and amassing 74 points. Clarenceville with a highly respected 6 and 1 dual meet record settled for second place to the Vikings with 43 points while the host school, Our Lady of Sorrows, tied with the Mustangs of Northville in third position with 36 points.

Junior Cliff LaFond of Sorrows continued his ways as he swept to victory in both of his matches in the 154-pound weight class. He defeated a tough Walled Lake foe, 11-1, in his opening match and came back to score a top-sided, 8-1, decision in the finals over a Northville mat rival.

Terry Callioth of OLS gained a second place finish with a pin in 5:50 of his first match. He was bested in his second match by a pin.

Jim Prisk of Clarenceville was both of his Heavyweight matches to capture top honors in the meet. He pinned Vic Carter of Northville in 5:34 of their opening round match and went on to score a 4-2 decision over Ron James of Walled Lake in the finals.

A total of seven Trojan wrestlers gained second place honors in the meet for CHS menor Ralph Temby. Don Yitlalo (103-lbs.) won over Tony Tucker of OLS on a 3-0 decision in the first round and then dropped a rugged 2-1 decision to his Walled Lake rival in the finals. Brian Lee bested Lance Brian Bates (112-lbs.) on a 4-2 decision and then bowed in the finals, 6-0. Ray Wheeler came up with a solid 12-0 deci-

Trojan Wrestlers Extend Win Streak

The Clarenceville High School wrestling team extended their dual meet winning streak to seven in action last week with victories over Detroit Country Day, 36 to 8, and South Lyon, 37 to 11.

Trojan wrestling mentor Ralph Temby has only two dual meets of the five remaining on the CIS schedule this season that could upset aspirations of establishing the finest team record in the school's history. Clarenceville entertains Livonia Franklin this week (Tuesday, February 1) and Journeys to John Glenn Feb. 8 for the only dual meet action likely to give the Trojans any difficulty. The other three remaining dual meets are with schools the Trojans have already met and defeated once this season: Northville, Redford Union and South Lyon.

Two new school records were set by Clarenceville wrestlers in the dual meet this past week with South Lyon.

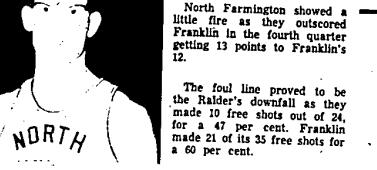
JERRY LITWIN, a 165-pound senior, broke his own school record for the fastest pin which he set in competition last season with the time of :19 seconds. Litwin's match with South Lyon's 165-pounder, Helmut ended just 19 seconds after it began with the Trojan grappler getting a pin. It's a record that will very likely stay on the books for a while at Clarenceville.

In the other record-breaking performance, Heavyweight Jim Prisk racked up the highest individual point total in Clarenceville wrestling competition when he decisioned James of South Lyon, 25-0. The record was previously held by Dave Kaipio who won a decision over an 18-point total last season. This is another record which will be very tough to break. In wrestling, points are awarded for take-downs, escapes, predicaments (holds giving advantage) and riding time (the length of time one wrestler holds advantage). In three two-minute periods of wrestling competition, it is unusual for a wrestler to score points in double figures since the various weight divisions are set up to

an outstanding job guarding Al Jose, Franklin's left guard and high scorer with 18 points, during the first quarter.

RAIDER SENIORS Rick Lorenz and Rich Schultz shared scoring honors on coach Dick Wilson's quintet with 17 point efforts.

The third quarter proved to be the clincher when Franklin scored two points for every North Farmington one.

North Farmington showed a little fire as they outscored Franklin in the fourth quarter getting 13 points to Franklin's 12.

The foul line proved to be the Raider's downfall as they made 10 free shots out of 24, for 47 per cent. Franklin made 21 of its 35 free shots for a 60 per cent.

Next week John Glenn plays host to the Raiders, who will battle for fifth place, against last place John Glenn.

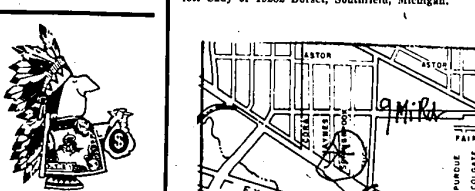

Township Board Proceedings

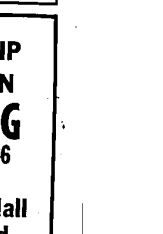
