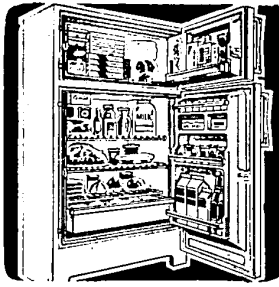


The Richardsons Welcome Baby Boy
