## Right To Work Is Debate Topic At St. Francis KC

Repeal of Section 14 B. of the Taft-Hartley Act, which limits the States to enact right-to-work laws, will be the subject of a debate to be held Wednesday, February 16, at 8:30 p.m. at St. Francis Council Hall in Farmington.

Speaking in favor of repeal will be Rev. Edward A. Keller, S.C.F., Professor of Economics at Notre Dame University. Father Keller is nationally known as an outspoken advocate of right-to-work legislation. The Education Department of the AFL-CIO is providing a speaker of equal stature who will urge repeal of this very controversial provision of the Taft-Hartley Act.

This topic is one of the timely issues of the day, and one that has been the subject of some of the bitterest debate seen in Congress in several years.
