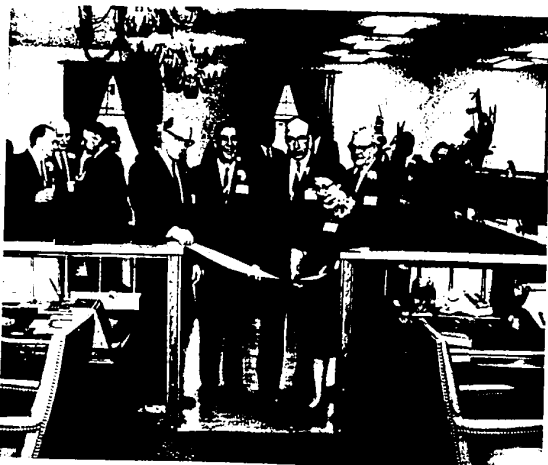
1st Lt. Gary Meade
