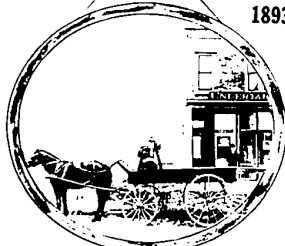
Mrs. Kibbie, leader of the new troop, extended to the Blue Star Mothers her thanks for the flag and that of the twenty members of the troop.
