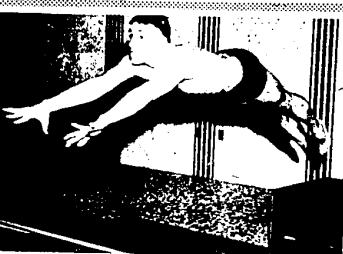

## CHS Takes 3rd; OLS 6th in Regional Mat Tourney

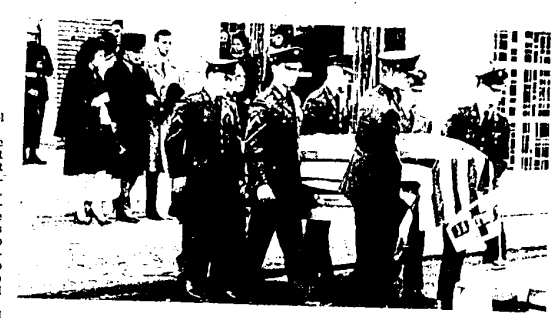
In the Class B Regional Wrestling Tournament staged last Friday and Saturday at River Rouge, two area teams placed in the top ten of 22 schools competing.
