Community Ch. Sets Camp Night

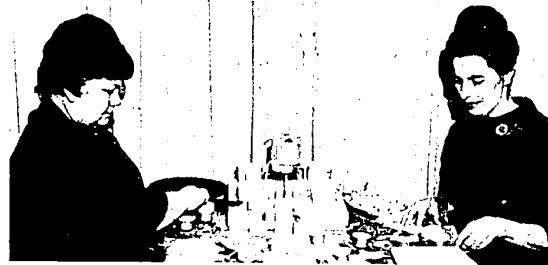
Spring Camp Night Service will be held at the Southfield Community Church, 21122 Indian (between Breech and Inkster, North of Eight Mile) on Sunday evening, March 13, at 7 p.m., according to Pastor Raymond Bayne.

Each summer, 15 to 100 of the young people from the church attend Camp Michawana of which the pastor is director. Now in its 20th season, Camp Michawana provides good time, valuable training, and spiritual inspiration for young people from over a hundred different churches and many different denominations every summer.

IN ADDITION to Bible study and campfire verses, Camp Michawana offers one of the finest Red Cross training waterfronts in the Nation, archery, riflery, handicraft, horseback, tournaments in tennis, badminton, ping pong and horseshoes, swimming and track meets, overnight campouts at a Sioux Indian Teepee and other features.
