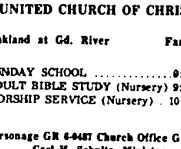

The Rev. William D. Mercer, Senior Minister of Nardin Park Church, and Dr. Sockman were boyhood acquaintances. A cordial invitation is extended to all in the area to attend this special service.

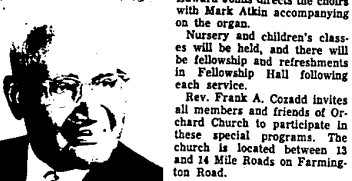

Relative to a Rezoning Request made for 4.8 acres in SW 1/4 Section 1 and the NE corner of Middlebelt and Northland Roads. The Planning Commission after Public Hearing on February 28, 1965, recommended denial. The Oakland County Board of Supervisors on December 22, 1965, could not so reason for disapproving this request for multiple zoning change. On January 18, 1966 another Public Hearing was held. The Board moved that the request be referred back to the Planning Commission for reconsideration. Original request is No. 62 dated 10-18-1965.

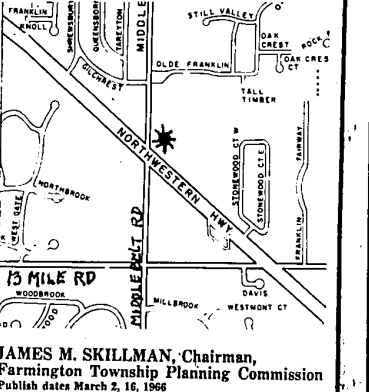
Petitioners request and the Planning Commission considers that the following described property be rezoned from parcels of B-1 business, O-Office and RA-1 single residential to also have RC-2 multiple residential classification and the property be used for low rise apartment development. The location is close to the NE corner of Middlebelt Road and Northland Highway.

The requested rezoning applies to the following described parcel:

A parcel of land being a part of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 1, Township 1 North, Range 9 East, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, more particularly described as: Beginning at a point on the west line of said Section 1, said Section 1, thence due South along the West line of said Section 1, 223.26 feet to a point; thence South 48 degrees 55 minutes East, parallel to the Northeastern line of Northland Highway (250.00 feet wide), 229.50 feet to a point; thence due South, parallel to the West line of said Section 1, 160.00 feet to a point on the Northeastern line of Northland Highway; thence South 48 degrees 55 minutes East 160.00 feet to a point; thence North 10 degrees 05 minutes East 125.00 feet to a point; thence North 10 degrees 05 minutes East 125.00 feet to a point; thence North 89 degrees 55 minutes West 125.00 feet to the point of beginning; subject to the rights of the public in and to the East 1/4 of Middlebelt Road, lying Easterly of, and adjoining, the West line of said Section 1; containing 4.822 acres of land more or less.
