Stage Annual Science Fair At O.E. Dunckel Jr. High

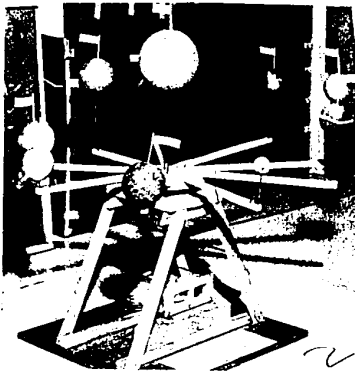
