As an ocean station vessel the cutter rotates with other cutters, standing month long watches at sea performing a multi-purpose task.

On station as part of the U.S. contribution to the Internation-al Civil Aviation Organization, the vessel collects weather data for use by transoceanic flights, and provides a navigational checkpoint for aircraft by con-firming positions through radar "fires" and sending radio bea-con navigational signals.

Her other duties include sci-entific studies of the ocean, which includes taking water samples, wave measurements and collecting samples of mic-roscopic plant life for the Coast Guard Oceanographic Unit in Washington, D.C.
