Creative Writing Course Dividends

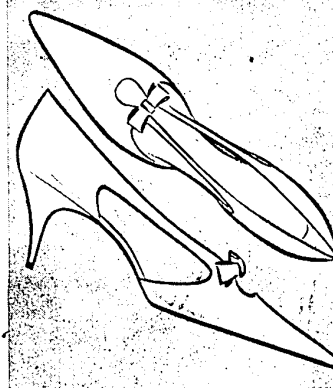

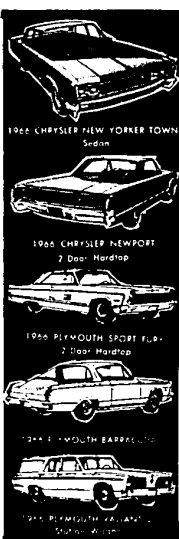
