As the great Mr. S. says in song, "It was a very good year." It was a year that saw a merger in the music business — a merger of sounds, rock and folk. The result of the marriage between the beat and the message was so overwhelming that it made recording stars out of such unknowns as Barry McGuire, Byrds, Sonny and Cher, The Turtles and a host of others.

1965 also saw a return of interest to American recording stars. Of course many of the better English groups maintained their popularity but in general, the emphasis returned to the States.

TV Teen shows, featuring record stars blossomed and died in the same year — probably due to the over-saturation caused by so many would-be imitators jumping on the bandwagon and thus killing the golden goose.

Sports Car Show Opens January 14

Greenfield Village will stage its fourteenth annual Sports Cars in Review show in the Henry Ford Museum Jan. 14 through Feb. 6.

"Les Pur-Sang," or the pure bloods, will be the theme of this annual exhibit of automobiles tracing the history of sports cars and their racing heritage. Five thoroughbred cars have been selected to form the central exhibit in the show. These are the 1933 Alfa-Romeo 8.6 roadster by Pignon, 1935 Hispano-Suiza V-12, 1932 Bugatti T-55, 1933 Delage DSS and a 1939 Talbot Lago.

Special programs have been arranged on each of the Friday evenings during the show. Three sportcar authorities will head the program, with a sponsor fashion show scheduled on final weekend.

Dave Davis, editor and publisher of Car and Driver magazine will speak on a review of sports cars on Friday, Jan. 14. R. M. Rodgers, special car manager, for Chrysler Corpora-

tion will speak on Jan. 21 on the organization of an automobile racing program and the diverse regulations of the automobile racing associations.

The Rebirth of the Cord will be the topic of Glenn A. Prey, on Friday, Jan. 28. Prey is president of the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Corp., which opened its assembly line of the new Cord 8/10 in December.
