

Missionaries Speak In Livonia About Vietnam

Many Americans are acting the same about Vietnam as the onlookers in New York who did nothing when a woman was stabbed to death in full view of the public. This is the feeling of two missionaries just returned from two years in Saigon.

They are Mr. and Mrs. Maurice C. Hall, missionaries with the Church of Christ, who are here to speak at a special meeting to be held at the Church of Christ, 15431 Merriman Rd., Livonia, Jan. 9, at 10:30 a.m.; 4 p.m., and 7:00 p.m.

The liberties of Vietnam are being stripped away with a Communist dagger, Hall said, "and America has, in many cases, assumed an 'I don't want to get involved' attitude."

"The United States has just cause," Hall said, "and is committed to that cause. It's very regrettable that Americans demonstrate against this country's efforts to bring freedom to other peoples."

"The war might have been won a few years ago had American people not presented a solid front, it could be 20 years before the war is decided one way or the other."

"Pseudo-intellectuals and even U.S. Senators have staged demonstrations and made demands that the United States withdraw from its position in Vietnam. These demonstrations and demands tend only to encourage Viet Cong fighting in the United States which actually withdraw."

"The Vietnamese are still in doubt about America's policy and therefore are afraid to act on their own," Mr. and Mrs. Hall said.

"The demonstrations here against U.S. involvement in Vietnam make headlines in the Vietnamese newspapers. The Vietnamese government and its people are friendly to the small number of American civilians still in the area," Mrs. Hall said, "however, they are bewildered about America's stand in Vietnam."

"The Viet Cong terrorizes the people by killing any who are caught acting against them," Hall said.

"I was told of one village where the children were lined up and gunned down because the Viet Cong learned that some of the villagers had revealed a V.C. position," he said. "In Vietnam you never know

The second narrow escape came when a V.C. fired from across the river at a Navy boat landing in Saigon. Hall and his son Ronnie were within a few yards of where the bullets fell.

It is the hope of the Halls to return to Vietnam in March, 1968. Mrs. Hall reports that she does not anticipate the tensions of living behind five strands of barbed wire, locked gates and doors, and hearing the explosions and heavy gun fire and seeing tanks and machine guns in the area, but she likes the American soldiers, have a job to do—job they "would not do for money, but they do for Christ."
