Twelfth Night Is Holiday for Revelers

If you are a devotee of wine, women, and song, then Twelfth Night is your own special holiday. Twelfth Night or Epiphany is traditionally the season of revelers.

It commemorates the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles through the visit of the three wise men (often styled the kings) to Bethlehem bearing gifts.

In Elizabethan times, the holiday became so boisterous and so lawless that the holiday became obsolete and instead of a national celebration it is now only celebrated in private clubs and societies.

The festivals always begin in the same manner. A special twelfth night cake is baked, which contains a bean, and another cake containing a small doll. Whoever receives the bean is chosen king of the revelers, and likewise the person who receives the doll becomes the queen.

A parade of trumpeters begins past, the king and queen who are seated under a canopy and thrives with their court, and at a given signal the king raises the wassail bowl and commands everyone to eat, drink, be merry and forget their cares.

Twelfth Night is still celebrated in New Orleans where it is the forerunner of the Lenten season.

One of the most beautiful ceremonies is observed yearly at Tarpon Springs, Florida, where it is known as the Blessing of the Sponge Divers. Thousands come each year to watch them for their examinations.
