

M Honors Nine Area Freshmen

Nine area freshmen are among 404 first year students at the University of Michigan participating in the academically select Honors Program. The figure is approximately 10 per cent of the 3,800 freshmen who entered the College of Literature, Science and the Arts for the fall semester. There are 301 sophomores, 233 juniors and 184 seniors in the 1,184 student program.

Michigan, with 258 honors freshmen, has the most in the program. Illinois, Ohio and New York with 48, 41 and 32 respectively are next in line among the 17 participating states.

The Honors Program, instituted in 1957, admits students on the basis of scholastic aptitude and achievement scores. The program consists of fulfilling basic distribution requirements in the freshman and sophomore years in special introductory courses.

"Enriched programs" are also elected by the Honors Students which cover the same subjects as regular courses but in greater depth.

In the junior and senior years, the Honors Students select majors in various departments and elect courses which intensify their studies leading to undergraduate degrees.
