Home Is A Business, Needs A File System

The average home nowadays is a small business establishment. The first requisite of any business is an adequate filing system. This is especially true in a home where records are needed over the years. The second requisite is a home office, even though it's just a room corner. To emphasize the need for home office facilities, John Concord, home improvement consultant to Masonite Corporation, listed some of the things a family should have on file. Appliances, cancelled checks and bank statements, insurance policies or policies, extra copies of legal papers such as wills, bonds and stock certificates; social security numbers and earnings records. Also, receipts of various types, by category; information needed at federal income tax filing time; records of church and other organization memberships, committees, and the like; family records; Christmas cards and birthday lists. Filing cabinets are inexpensive and essential. So is a desk. So is a place to put them—preferably a nook handy to the kitchen, for instance, if the primary record-keeping is done by the homemaker. Other locations are a porch, bedroom, den, living room corner or a partitioned space in a recreation area. To help establish the office as a businesslike place, it's important to have it look pleasant and efficient. Paneling the area with handsome woodgrained hardboard panels as Masonite Royalcote is about the easiest way to do this, Concord points out. Panels go up quickly with a cardstock-type adhesive. Even the amateur craftsman can make a creditable installation. The prefabricated panels require no decorating and only damp-proof maintenance.

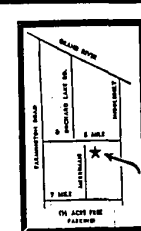
If a structural member is interfering with arrangement of space, it can sometimes be made part of a divider, or covered by a built-in, or used as the center pole of a circular bench.

FHA Issues New Policy On Incomes

Perry E. Willis, president of the National Association of Home Builders, recently praised FHA's new liberalized policy on "working wives' income."

FHA insurance offices have been instructed by Commissioner P. N. Brownstein to give more consideration to a wife's income in qualifying married couples for a mortgage insurance and payment.

"This new policy," Willis said, "recognizes the reality of the times and will enable many young married people to purchase the homes they want and need and can afford when a wife's income is given due consideration."

"For many young people, this policy will open the doors earlier to home ownership and to the stability of family home life."

Brownstein, in announcing the new policy, said the primary reason is the trend in recent years for wives to resume employment after a childbirth.

He noted that many employers now offer maternity leave benefits and guarantee re-employment rights and that the period of interrupted income is typically short. The financial impact, Brownstein said, frequently is lessened by insurance or hospitalization plans. These considerations, he added, make it possible for FHA to give less weight to the wife's income in measuring the family's effective income for repayment of the mortgage debt.

Mobile Units Are Popular

In the market for a mobile home? If so, you're one of a tribe that is rapidly increasing. According to Stan Johnson, manager of fiberboard sales for a major supplier of subflooring material for mobile homes: "One-sixth of all new single-family homes—some 200,000 will be mobile in 1968."

In fact, "adds Johnson, 'mobile homes have become a major factor in the less-than \$10,000 home market."

The units account for one out of every three new residences in this price range, and their share of the market is growing larger each year."

Mobile homes are particularly popular with the 20-29 year-old age bracket, the segment of the U.S. population that is enjoying the fastest rate of growth.

The days when trailer living was austere at best, have been long since gone. Today's mobile homes range in price from \$3,000 to \$12,000 with an average of about \$5,600. Johnson reports that most late model mobile homes boast virtually all the comforts of any home including the last word in kitchen appliances, air-conditioning and wall-to-wall carpeting.

Keeping pace in improvements in the mobile homes themselves, today's mobile home parks offer swimming pools, recreation facilities, shopping centers and other accoutrements of gracious living.
