## Mental Health During Change Is Today's Teacher's Workshop Topic

Dr. Kenneth Davidson, professor of psychology at Wayne State University, is the keynote speaker of the Farmington elementary school teachers workshop today (Wednesday) and tomorrow afternoon. General theme of the workshop is "With Growth Comes Change." Speakers making presentations include: Dr. Armin Grams, head of the human development program at the Merrill-Palmer Institute; David Cason, Jr., a faculty member at Merrill-Palmer; and Evelyn Kildreth, director of services for the Oakland County Department of Health. Other speakers are: Dr. Virginia Svager, psychiatrist with the Oakland County Schools; and Dr. James Sonnega, staff psychiatrist at Hawthorne Center and a consultant for the Oakland County Schools. Dr. Grams, author of the book "Children and Their Parents," teaches and conducts research in parent-child relationships at Merrill-Palmer Institute. He is also coordinator of parent education activities. His presentation will ask and answer the question: "How can schools, how can the individual teacher better serve parents in meeting their responsibility to provide a climate which will foster success instead of failure in the early elementary grades?" Cason, who holds a MA from Wayne State University, is employed in the sociology and urban planning field at Merrill-Palmer. His presentation will be in the area of community dynamics and how the teacher is influenced by the community.
