Legislature to Write New Laws

Legislative action in 1966 will focus attention on providing the support necessary to strengthen Michigan's law enforcement agencies, State Representative John Bennett of Redford Town-

ship, announced today. He said the Democrats would establish a system of centralized pooling of information for law enforcement agencies using automatic data processing equipment.

—Provide more rigid control and heavier penalties for possession of dangerous drugs.

—Establish minimum qualification guidelines and salary levels for police officers.

—Establish minimum qualification standards and salary levels for prosecuting attorneys.

—Increase the severity of penalties for assault on known police officers.

—Comprehensive traffic safety program. Complete revision of the Michigan Vehicle Code. Better driver licensing examinations.

—Imposition of a 90-day suspension of driver's license of any person convicted of operating a motor vehicle in a manner to elude apprehension by a police officer.

—Study the feasibility and value of establishing compulsory mother vehicle inspection in Michigan.

Other items high on the 1966 legislative agenda, Bennett said are:

—Incentive award and greatly expanded scholarship program.

—Comprehensive program dealing with education at all levels.

—Explore ways to aid qualified students at private colleges.

—State grants for development of municipal recreation facilities.

—State Grants for water and air anti-pollution projects.

—Expansion of day care facilities for mentally retarded.

—Long range plan for accelerated development of state parks and public recreation areas.

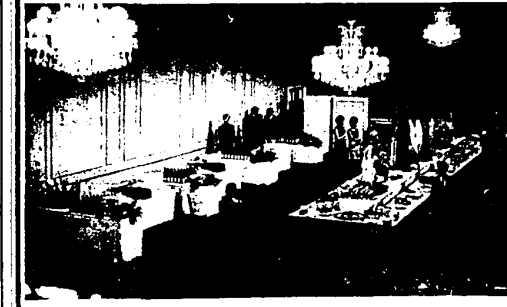
Industrial Arts Group Visits Area

A group of Eastern Michigan University students who plan to teach industrial arts visited Franklin High and Emerson Junior High schools last week to observe classes and ask questions about the various vocational programs in Livonia secondary schools.

The group of 15, led by Eastern Michigan University Professor Gerald L. Jennings, expressed pleasure at the wide variety of programs offered in Livonia and told Arlin Fairman, coordinator of vocational education instruction, that they would seriously consider teaching in this area once they had earned their degrees and teaching certificates.

Joe Knight, Emerson industrial education teacher, explained the junior high program and outlined the philosophy followed in the Livonia system to prepare young people interested in vocational and craft careers in the metropolitan area.
