Evans Lands New \$3 Million Order

The booming rail car business at the Railway Car Division of Evans Products Co. in Plymouth received another boost Monday when Executive Vice President James Conway, in charge of the Railway Transportation Equipment Division, announced a \$3 million order for 235 40-foot box cars.

The order, from Seaboard Air Line Railroad in Richmond, Va., calls for delivery in the third quarter of the year.

Evans recently announced a \$2.8 million car building plant expansion to the Plymouth facility following a previously announced addition at the same plant.

The newest addition, which has a target date of late spring, will boost the capacity from the present five to 10 new freight cars daily.

It was just a week ago that Conway announced awarding of a contract for a 22,000 square foot administration building which is scheduled for completion about July 1.

The new building will contain the Transportation Equipment Group's headquarters as well as offices of the administrative and engineering personnel of the Railway Car Division.
