

Motorists Urged to Get Plates Now; Avoid Deadline Jam

LANSING — A good measure of responsible citizenry, according to Secretary of State James M. Hare, is to be able to answer "yes" to the question of "have you purchased your 1966 license plates?"

Hare predicted the "biggest deadline log-jam" in history if motorists didn't buy their plates before February 15. Deadline is February 28.

"We're ahead of our 1965 sales by nearly 150,000," said Hare, "but this actually puts us behind instead of ahead, since we've been gaining more than 200,000 licenses a year."

He scored the new Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Fund collections as slowing and complicating sales.

At the end of January, a total of 1,493,459 plates had been sold, a high for this date. Hare estimated that more than three million plates would be sold by February 28.

He said collections of \$35 from all uninsured vehicle owners under the new Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Fund were "running very low," in some localities under one percent of total sales.

Motorists were reminded again that they should have to have the following when they buy plates:

- Drivers must have:
- Prior year's registration or certificate of title;
- Proof of in-effect liability insurance and \$1 insured fee, or \$35 to pay uninsured motorist fee; and
- A hundred-weight. Hare said his branches are accepting as proof of liability insurance the following:

- (1) An insurance certificate furnished by the insurance company;
- (2) The actual in-effect policy;
- (3) A letter or affidavit from a recognized agent attesting to the fact that the person has insurance;
- (4) An identification card which lists the type of vehicle and expiration date of the policy.

991 X-Rays Taken in TB Tests

A total of 991 chest X-rays were taken during a two-day survey at Westland Shopping Center Jan. 27-28, the Tuberculosis and Health Society, Wayne County's Christmas Seal organization, reported Monday.

The mobile X-ray unit was sent to the area through the courtesy of the Detroit Department of Health after the outbreak of tuberculosis among children in a Garden City preschool nursery.

The technicians attached to the mobile unit, Xavier Lafuente and Benedict Temerowski, averaged 90 X-rays per hour for the two-day period. They gave 455 chest X-rays on Thursday and 438 on Friday.
