Teen Program Gets Underway Afternoons

THINK F.A.S.T.!! That's the slogan of the Farmington After School program sponsored by the Farmington YMCA for Farmington Junior High Schoolers. The program utilizes the facilities of the First Methodist Church and is conducted Monday and Tuesday afternoons from 3:30 to 5 p.m.

A steering committee of students from Farmington Junior High School have been meeting for two months planning the program.

At this time there are plans to expand the program to include: social and recreational activities; service programs; study rooms; individual and group tutoring; discussion groups; outings; and others as needed.

The Farmington YMCA staff, FAYAC members, Rev. Dave Stone, Mrs. Margaret Morris, Rev. Bob Sawyer, Mrs. Rita Mosshamer and

others are providing the leadership in the program.

A snack bar is open each afternoon and the FAYAC Council is busy working out the details of a membership system for the program and a more formal Council organization. Any junior high school youth belonging to the YMCA may attend regular activities at no charge.

K of C Sets 14B Debate

Repeal of Section 14B of the Taft-Hartley Act, which permits the States to enact right-to-work laws, will be the subject of a debate Feb. 16 at 8:30 p.m. at St. Francis Council Hall in Farmington.

Speaking against 14B repeal will be Rev. Edward A. Keller, C.S.C., Professor of Economics at Notre Dame University. Keller is nationally known as an outspoken advocate of right-to-work legislation. The Education Department of the AFL-CIO is providing a speaker of equal stature who will urge repeal of this very controversial provision of the Taft-Hartley Act.

This topic is one of the most timely issues of the day, and one that has been the subject of some of the bitterest debate seen in Congress in several years.

Youth Reports Fight in Farmington

Gary Grant, 18, of 20014 Parkville, Livonia, has told Farmington Police that he saw the drivers of two cars at Grand River and Middlebelt yelling at each other on the evening of Feb. 4 and that they raced west on Grand River trying to cut each other off.

When the cars turned down Lilac, Grant told police, he followed them and found that the inhabitants of one car, a 1963 Ford, were heading up Robert H. Welsbacher of Milford, the driver of the other car.

He reported that he got out of the car to help Welsbacher and the two men hit Welsbacher again with a tool kit. Grant said that the men told him to mind his own business and that the driver of the Ford pulled a knife.

At that point Grant left and hailed a passing school car. When the police arrived, Welsbacher had knocked at the door of Geleena Champhene, 22436 Lilac, and was inside having his wounds washed. Police took Welsbacher to Botsford Hospital where he was treated for cuts on the face.

Welsbacher told police that

he did not know who the men were and that he would not be willing to sign out a complaint if the men were captured.

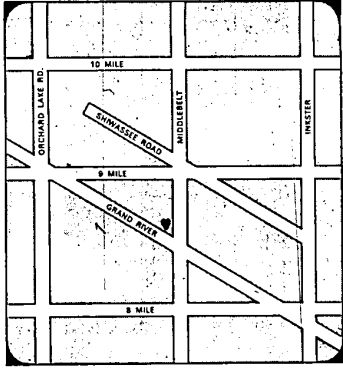
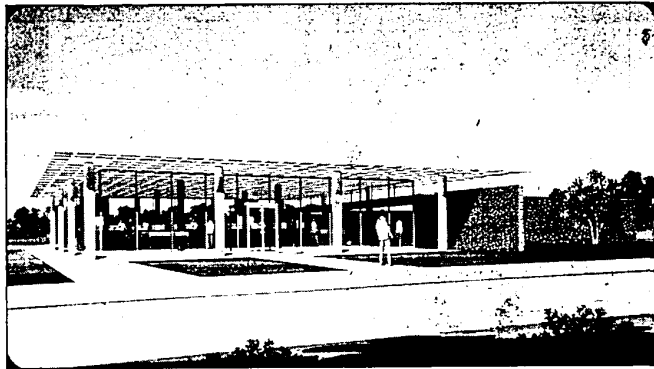
Grant described the driver of the Ford as a man of about 20 with brown or black curly hair and wearing a black jacket. He told police that he would recognize him.
