**Wilder Classic Is 'A Kinetic Delight'**

Mammoths, dinosaurs, the inventor of the wheel, Homer, Moses, Cain, Noah's Ark, Sonny Eliot, some "A-Go-Go" dancers, and strains of "We Shall Overcome" all blend together to make the University of Detroit's production of "The Skin of Our Teeth" a visual, kinetic delight.

A huge cast of 40 talented folks make this Alan Jorgensen version of the Thornton Wilder Pulitzer Prize play have new bite in its satire. Originally produced in 1942 when he hovered on the edge of world-wide defeat by the determined little men of Asia—the Nipponis—"Skin of Our Teeth" in 1966 has retained every bit of its incisiveness.

Director Alan Jorgensen has updated the play cleverly. Although Wilder's dialogue has an eternal quality, a little help here and there via stage business or the plangent underscoring of a scene or speech for Jorgensen makes this "Skin" a triumph.

The use of the echo chamber to give the convention scene a touch of super-realism, the somber mortuary-like throbbing of an eerie organ to punctuate the Fortune Teller sequence, and the foot-tapping rhythms of Sousa as an overture are only a few of the many aural plums for the audience to titillate their eardrums.

Visually, the settings and costumes by Bert Runkle and Betty Warner set the mood properly and add to the general excitement. Dominic Missini's choreography spills out into the audience; in fact, it swirls and surrounds you so that you are caught up with its infectious quality. Chuck Derry's colorful slides provide further icing on the U of D's theatrical bonanza.

Perry Mallette, Alice Broder, Vicki Witkowski, Roslyn Hayward, Jackie Phillips, and Kelly Burke prove that Broadway favorites such as E. G. Marshall, Frederic March, Florence Eberhardt, and Tallulah Bankhead weren't the only people that could play "Skin of Our Teeth" so beautifully. This U of D series plus one more that the torch of professionalism in the theater can be found on the third floor of the U of D library as well as in New York City.

To be fair to the rest of cast who really would have to admit that no matter how small the role every member acquitted themselves superbly. "Skin" will be playing at the U of D Library weekends until Feb. 20. Take time to see a rip-roaring, rousing version of "Skin of Our Teeth".

Let's hope that University authorities can see their way clear to give these fine production more exposure by repeating it during the summer term repertory. All of us missed the summer repertory group last year. Let the nominate "Skin" as the production to study repeat for the starwark trade.
