affected by a change in government administration.
It found no reason to change the present plan, yet it noted that incorporation would include two villages that now handle these functions themselves. The subcommittee urged that their guidelines be respected.
Another finding of Nolan's committee was that a city may regulate existing buildings, which the present Township Board cannot do.
Brennan told the audience, in answer to the objection brought forth at the last meeting that "these subcommittee reports are being accepted without the people even having a chance to read them," that subcommittee reports are not final.
"They will all be concealed into a final report to be proposed for adoption at the last meeting," said Brennan.
After the reading of the report a Farmington resident said that it was an injustice to prospective voters to have to decide on the incorporation question without having the benefit of reading the subcommittee reports. He waved a dollar bill and offered to be the first to contribute towards the expense of mailing the reports to all township homes.
Brennan estimated the cost near \$600 but appointed committee member Douglas MacArthur, treasurer of the new information fund, and asked anyone who wished to contribute to send their donations to MacArthur at 21218 St. Francis or Brennan's office at 33245 Grand River.
Don Oakes, charter consultant to the committee, tried to quell some doubts over incorporation. He said that when the residents of a township vote to give so many mills to parks, for example, the revenue will go to the park commission even if it is more than necessary.
"A self-building bureaucracy is liable to develop," he said. "On the other hand, if city residents vote so much in tax dollars to the city, once the ceiling is reached for your parks department, the rest will go to other owners can be confident that their money will not be wasted."

bridge when and if we come to it," he said.
All of the Councilmen present, except Peter P. P. Thayer and Yoder—voted to authorize the City Manager to prepare the application for the federal funds.
Another objection to the plan came from Councilman Thayer and from W. Allen Nelson, a member of the Planning Commission who emphasized that he was speaking as "a private citizen and a taxpayer."
Their objection was that if the City tied up its \$9,000 budget for capital improvement there would be no funds for developing the land.
Dinan said that the Council could allocate additional funds and if the City purchased the land there would be a long range program for improving and developing the sites. "After all the land just lying fallow wouldn't do us any good," he observed.
