The Swinnore built-in is a frostless freezer compartment with a basket arrangement permitting the entire contents, including ice cubes, to swing out with the freezer door.

The front decorator panels are available in Provincial, Frontier, French Elegance, Empire, Contemporary Walnut and Birch styling.

The problem of right or left hand models is completely eliminated by the swing-out twin-door principle. The twin doors seal tightly in the middle without use of a center post.

The Kenmore Classic pilotless gas range is electronically ignited, operated on a principle of electric arcs igniting a flame within two seconds after the burner is turned on. The "pilotless" concept promises advances of safety and economy.

All parts, including a glass-covered control panel, stainless steel back panel, and all porcelain interior, requires no scouring and can be wiped clean with a damp cloth. Decorator styles in the ranges come in white, copertone or a completely new walnut finish.

A brief business meeting will be held to discuss plans for the 1967 Delta Gamma Founders Day banquet as well as future projects to aid the blind in the Detroit area.



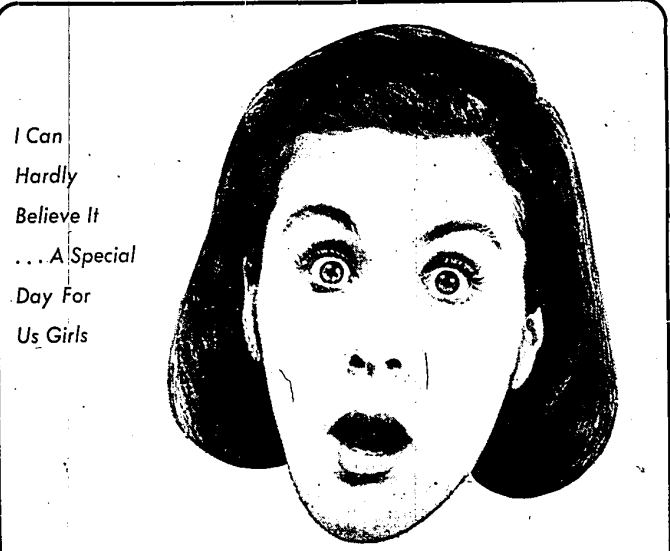
