Little Boy Needs Help

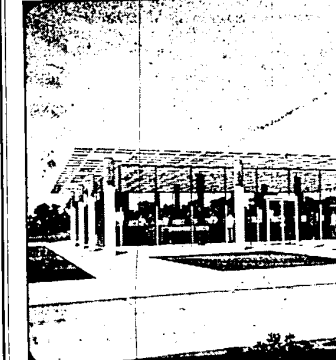
Life isn't always easy for a 10-year-old boy - particularly when he is puzzled and sad.

Country Lanes Gets Dance Permit in Twp.

Country Lanes of Farmington has received its dance permit. Action approving the license was taken at the Farmington Township Board's regular meeting Monday night.

The matter had earlier been tabled.

Two Board members—Township Treasurer Elsie Avery and Trustee Earl Opperbacher were not present at the meeting. Mrs. Avery has been outspoken in the past about her opposition to dance permits within the Township.

Country Lanes requested the permit for two reasons in order not to be in violation with the ordinance and draw a violation citation from the State Liquor Control Commission and as a convenience to its customers.

The dance floor will comprise of 200 square feet in the southeast corner of the establishment.

In other action the Board:

- Approved the granting of a Class C liquor license to the Roman House on Grand River;
- Approved the transfer of a SMI license at 3044 W. Eight Mile Rd. from George Dirbas to Clair A. Harb contingent on the payment of the personal property tax due;
- Approved the final site plan for the Hunter's Ridge Multiple Development contingent on the filing of a revised site plan with the modifications requested by the Township Planning Commission;
- Tabled approval of the proposed membership of the Farmington General Citizens Youth Guidance Committee and naming a new member of the Township Board of Review; and
- Acted on a letter from the Lincolnshire Estates Association to order street lights for the area contingent to the approval of the subdivision as the place and cost of the lights.

Rabies Shots To Be Given in Township

Innoculations will be given to dogs for rabies at the Farmington Township Fire Hall at 21420 Wheeler St. on Feb. 19 by the Oakland County Animal Welfare Department. Hours are from 1 to 4 p.m.

State law requires that all dogs be licensed annually and a certificate of inoculation must be furnished when purchasing the license.

Dog licenses are currently on sale at the Farmington Township Treasurer's office. Prior to March 1 the license will cost \$1 for male or spayed dogs and \$2 for females. After the March 1, date, however, the price goes up to \$7.50 and \$5.
