Farnum Supports Labeling

Congressman Billie S. Farnum (D. of Michigan's 19th Dist.) introduced a fair packaging and labeling bill in Congress today. This bill is similar to the bill introduced by Senator Philip A. Hart (D-Mich.) in the Senate last session.

"The Pure Food and Drug Act, enacted in 1906, has been improved by amendments through the years. But the enactment of this bill would be a major step in providing the consumer protection against deceptive packaging and labeling," Farnum said.

"An essential element of a free enterprise system is the free choice of a knowing consumer between products whose quality and price are known. Deceptive practices in packaging and labeling remove this element," he continued.

Farnum's bill would prohibit interstate commerce packages whose net quantities are not clearly and succinctly marked in a prominent place, and prohibit labeling with deceptive 'tent off' prices or sizes which in reality do not give the consumer a bargain below the ordinary retail price.

Farnum said, "This bill is designed to protect not only the consumer but also the honest businessman who has been subjected to unfair marketing practices by less scrupulous competitors."
