**Farmington Township 'Cool' to Incinerator**

Farmington Township has indicated a "cool" interest in the proposal by the City of Livonia to create an authority to construct and operate a 300 to 500 ton incinerator.

Board action came at the governing body's regular session Monday night following a letter from the City of Livonia asking whether or not they would be interested in participating in the authority of contracting for the services of the incinerator.

Farmington Township Supervisor Curt Hall told the Board that the Detroit Regional Planning Commission Study which would probably be released in a few months would carry the recommendation for a proposed authority for the six county area.

"I think that some provision will be made in Oakland County before our need becomes crucial," Hall said, and "I think talk about entering into a contract is premature."

All of the Township officials, however, are aware that this is a growing problem and one that will have to be dealt with in the future. With this in mind they agreed to contact the City of Livonia indicating an interest, but making no definite commitment.

The City of Farmington's Council took the same action at its regular meeting last week. In addition to the Farmington communities, the City of Livonia has contacted Redford Township, Plymouth and Plymouth Township, Novi and Northville on the proposal.
