### To Start Work in 2 Months

The long awaited and much anticipated announcement of a major plant moving into Plymouth Township became a reality Tuesday afternoon when Ford Motor Co. announced plants to build a 642,000 square foot plant on Int. Motor Road morth of Western Electric to manufacture heaters and air conditioners.

It had been rumored for several weeks that one of automobile's "Big Three" was planning a major operation in Plymonth Township but it had been more or less of a "hush-hush" sereet until Taesday's announcement.
