4 Charged With Disorderliness

Four men, two from Livonia, one each from Garden City and Nankin, face charges of disorderly persons, interfering with an officer and resisting arrest following an altercation at the Day Drive In, 31500 Plymouth Road, in which one of the arresting officers was injured.
The four are:
Charles Harper, 19, 38521 Schoolcraft, Livonia.
David Horabacher, 23, 3317 Ann Arbor Trail, Nankin.
Rodney Richardson, 21, 31928 Rock, Garden City.
John Highland, 21, 29115 Hathaway, Livonia.
The quartet was arraigned in Livonia Municipal Court Monday morning and released on \$50 bond pending a hearing later in March.
Patrolman George Favar, one of the officers ordered to the scene when Manager Kenneth Blumch called in for help after reporting trouble with several boys, suffered a dislocated shoulder during a scuffle in attempting to arrest Harper. Harper was finally subdued with the assistance of Patrolman Arthur Rickland, who accompanied Favar in the squad car.
Blumch told the investigating officers that he had ordered the young man to leave after a series of arguments developed over leaving cars.
He was talking to the four when Patrolman Favar and Rickland arrived. The officers ordered the four to leave but first Harper and then Highland refused and began using obscene language, according to the police reports.
Favar attempted to arrest Harper but ran into resistance and in the scuffling, he fell to the ground and suffered the shoulder injury. Rickland came to his aid and they finally put handcuffs on the scrappy Harper.
It was the same story with each of the quartet with the exception that another squad car with Corporal Richard Czekiewicz and Patrolman Robert Zaslach arrived and aided in the arrests.
Church Secretary Louise Havlick reported the incident to police and estimated the damage at more than \$25.



James Russell Lowell, Name of New Jr. High

The new junior high school, which will serve nearly a thousand 7th, 8th, and 9th graders living in the southwestern corner of the district in the fall of 1967, will bear the name of James Russell Lowell, outstanding 19th century New England poet.
Trustee Geraldine Joyner, who initiated the motion, pointed out there was no good reason to put off naming the school which will be on Hill road south of Joy road, after the famed poet, humorist, and teacher.
"Many people in the community got confused when we refer to a new facility as Section 6 Junior high," Mrs. Joyner said. "We may as well name the school now so youngsters and parents in that area can identify with it as they see it take shape."
Lowell, who was born in 1819 and died in 1895, was a graduate of the Harvard Law School. He composed scintillating poetry while waiting for law business after he set up practice.



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Security Police

Carl Berkstrom, 49, of 14808 Melvin, Livonia, has filed a complaint with Livonia Police charging two security policemen at Ward's in the Wonderland Shopping Center with assault and battery, according to police reports.
Berkstrom, a teacher in the Garden City school system who has to walk with a cane, charges he was grabbed by the two security officers (who allegedly are members of the Livonia Police department with permission to work as security officers as long as it doesn't interfere with their regular duties) while walking outside the Livonia store with a record under his arm.
Berkstrom reports he told the officers he had borrowed the record from a friend who had gone to Ward's with the intention of having a copy made of one side.
Despite his protests that the record was in the store, he reportedly grabbed him by the arm and forced him to the store to their offices in the store. He complained to his report to Livonia Police that he was manhandled and subjected to obscene language.
After making a check with his friend, Berkstrom reports the officers released him with the alleged statement "we have had lots of your type here, get out."
He reported he had to go to St. Mary Hospital for a checkup where examination revealed bruises, a pulled muscle but no broken bones.
Reports from the Livonia Police show that investigating officers have requested a warrant on a charge of assault and battery from the Assistant Prosecuting Attorney John Mowatt. He is expected to make a decision within a few days.
