### Birmingham Community House Offers An Evening of Superb Entertainment

Small tables, with softly shaded candles, rich Italian food, and later a tour through modern Rome to see its magnificent fountains at Villa D'Este near Tivoli, the Spanish steps, and the 12th century cloister of the four uncrowned saints. Must you travel across the ocean for this? Not really! The Birmingham Community House has been featuring a series of wonderful travel films, and before hand they have been serving a dinner of foods famous in that country.

Friday and Saturday, March 4 and 5th, they featured "Eternal Rome." The carpeted dining room was centered with individual tables and the service was excellent. The food was out of this world. The Italian dinner consisted of such delicacies as Italian vegetable soup, chicken smothered with fresh mushrooms, green peppers, crisp green salads, lasagne, and of course the antipasto and hot breads.

Deserts of all kinds from chocolate angel food ice-ber cake to Italian ice cream with fruits and nuts were placed on a long buffet table and you served yourself.

Afterwards, downstairs there was Nicol Smith's new, all color film on "Rome, the Eternal City." It narrated it. The viewer was taken into an entirely different world, and I am sure even the most experienced traveler never saw as much of the city, or had as varied a tour. There was the beautiful ancient places, monuments and works of art; famous churches, modern apartments and shops, a shopping center, outstanding restaurants and fashion houses; and the amazing cats of Rome, almost sacred since Pagan times.

The Vatican City, beautiful on an Easter Sunday morning, is an important part of Smith's film, showing the Pope and Cardinals at the crowning of a new saint and the Swiss guards at the Vatican taking their oath. Rome is home to some of the finest jewelry in the world, and armchair travelers saw millions of dollars worth of gems on display. The magnificent horses of the International Jumping Teams at Piazza di Siena take a proud place among Roman sports, as does soccer, track, and swimming.

This travel series is one of the many features presented by the Birmingham Community House. Their Fund drive has just been opened and they have the support of other leading communities because of the continuing effort by The Community House to benefit these communities by meeting their civic, cultural, educational, and social needs.

The continually expanding educational program offered more than 35 different class opportunities this last year. Its special events have included the popular travel film series, annual Ski Show and a six-lecture series on security investing.
