Northville State Hospital Auxiliary Unit Plans Interdenominational Chapel

Over 90 attended the eighth birthday luncheon of the Northville State Hospital Auxiliary in the hospital's "A" Building Cafeteria. A Valentine motif lent color to the tables. Following the luncheon, members of a panel, moderated by Mrs. Ann Lang, N.S.H. Auxiliary president, discussed the possibility of an interdenominational chapel being constructed on the grounds of the hospital. Not only were three of the present chaplains of the hospital—Rabbi Sol Gruskin (23600 Kenosha, Oak Park), Father Paul Lederer, and Rev. George Jerome (743 Horton, Northville)—present to lend their views, but, in addition, Rev. Malcolm Ballenger, Chaplain of the University of Michigan Hospital, William Cook, Director of Community Relations at Ypsilanti State Hospital, which has had a chapel since the mid-50's, and Mrs. Eleanor Nelson R. N. (of Walled Lake) one of the N.S.H. nursing supervisors, offered their viewpoints and comments. All agreed that such a project would constitute a major financial undertaking. Yet they were unanimous that such an edifice, with its availability for religious services and week-long use, well could stand as an important and central resource in a modern mental hospital. Already 18 individuals and groups have donated over \$14,400 into the hospital's Chapel Fund. Members of the hospital's interdenominational Chapel Committee are, in addition to the hospital's three chaplains who were on the program: Rev. David Romberg, the hospital's Chaplain for its Missouri Lutheran parishes (Pastor, Lutheran Church of the Risen Christ, Plymouth); Mrs. Louis Pearlman, 29099 Hillbrook, Livonia; Northville State Hospital Auxiliary; Mrs. Ann Lang, 105 Linden, Northville; Northville State Hospital Auxiliary president; Louis J. Schmidt, 34035 Doris, Livonia, Director of Community Relations, Northville State Hospital.
