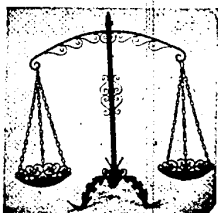

Last Sex Education Classes Set

The last series of Sex Education courses for this school year will be offered by the Farmington Area YMCA at East Junior High School. The two part course will meet from 7 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, March 29, and Tuesday, April 5.

Past classes were offered this year at the Farmington Junior High School and the O. E. Duane Junior High School. Since its inception in 1963, the program has served more than 1,100 Farmington families.

Dr. Ed Blumberg, a practicing physician, and Rev. Richard Markham, pastor of the First Methodist Church of Farmington, conduct both sessions.

"Growth and Development" is covered at the first session. This includes physical changes, physical effects of change, emotional change, feelings and popular misconceptions.

The second session includes discussion on the topic of "Mating Socially and Spiritually" which covers self-control, moods, group pressure and discipline. "Human Reproduction" is also covered at the second session through the use of a film and followed by comments from Dr. Blumberg.

Due to the nature of the subject, it is necessary to limit the number of families who can attend. At least one parent must accompany the child. For maximum benefit, attendance at both sessions is encouraged.

A \$2 per family registration fee is necessary to cover expenses. Pre-registration is necessary. Call the YMCA at 474-3232 for further information.

Council Tables Alarm for Sewer

Boyd Baker of 23829 Colchester Ave., in the City of Farmington's Bel Aire Subdivision was back at the Council meeting Monday night seeking a solution to his problem with the sewer backing up into his basement.

He didn't get a new, concrete solution.

City Manager John Dinan proposed an alarm system which would alert the neighborhood when the sewer backed up to a dangerous level.

The Councilmen didn't really like this idea and would rather see an alarm system hooked into the police department which is staffed 24 hours a day.

However, they also told City Manager Dinan to try regular check ups of the line and regular maintenance to see if that would help.

Pending this action for a few weeks the council tabled the alarm proposal.
