

# Tri-County Republican Seminar To Draw Over 300 Republicans

## Our Queen of Hearts "Says it with Butter"

Semantically speaking, there is no satisfactory substitute for the word Butter.

Can you imagine how the language would suffer if we were to say, "The baby is a cute little margarine ball?"

If you set about to flatter someone, could it be said you would margarine him up?

Where would President Johnson's public relations department be if it had to wrestle with the problem of guns or margarine?

How appealing would you find a hot margarine run? Gastronomically speaking, there is no substitute for butter either.

There may be many recipes where it doesn't matter. My general guideline is this: If the flavor of another ingredient is going to cover the butter flavor, then there is nothing wrong with using the lowest priced spread.

I know well, from years of cooking economically, that you can live a rich and full life and never buy butter. No recipe you find here in the Queen of Hearts, however, will ever say "butter or margarine," because I figure the responsibility for substituting should be left to the cook, who will take into consideration, the taste, the pocketbook, the tastebuds, and what is on hand.

Some recipes are worth a trip to the supermarket to buy butter. A good butter, pasty, delicate butter cookies like spritz, exquisite butter sauces — these delightful things shouldn't be fooled around with. Make something else, something that doesn't depend upon the flavor of butter for its special goodness.

The following recipes may be made with either-priced spread. They are designed to add a dimension of taste to your everyday cooking without undue labor or expense. They will lighten company menus too.

**HERB BUTTERS** (For vegetables) and best together:

To 1 stick of butter add:

- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley

or:

- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 teaspoon chopped chives

or:

- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 cup prepared horseradish (well drained)
- 2 teaspoons minced chives

or:

- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon dry basil (or more to taste)
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley

**CHEESE BUTTERS** (For meats and hot sandwiches)

To one stick of butter add and blend thoroughly:

- 3 to 4 ounces bleu cheese
- 1 garlic clove (crushed)
- 1/2 cup chianti wine
- 2 tablespoons prepared mustard

Chill to blend flavors, soften before serving.

or:

- 1/2 cup grated parmesan
- 1 cup grated romano
- 1/2 cup chianti wine
- 1 teaspoon salt
- and a dash each of onion powder, celery salt, oregano, basil, thyme

or:

- 1 1/2 ounces Roquefort cheese
- 1/2 cup white wine
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- and a dash each of onion powder, garlic salt, celery salt, paprika, and margarine

**SWEET BUTTERS** (For hot muffins and pancakes)

To one stick of butter add and blend till fluffy:

- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 cup orange juice

or:

- 3 tablespoons cream
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

It has been said that the difference between a good cook and an excellent one is a little bit of butter. Give it a whirl.
