

She loves lettuce and carrots. She is gold, black and white. Her name is "Queenie." And most important, she is the focal point in capturing the attention of the pre-school children at the Webster Preschool Child and Parent Education Center at West Grand Boulevard and

Forter. Mirs. Stanley Dolen, of Redford Township, who heads the center finds "Queenie," a guinea pig; an invaluable aid in teaching children hutrition, cleanliness and many other qualities essential for successful living.

Many people are trained to a job, some fall into it, and some people are born for it. Mrs. Dolen, we feel, is one of these latter people. She loves children and what is more important, genuinely understands them and the problems they encounter.

Her students are among what are commonly called the "underprivileged" and therefore have special problems in adapting to the schoolroom. We have come close to dispelling many wrong facts in this generation, and we feel one of the old ideas that is going by the board is that certain children are unable to learn. Mrs. Dolen feels that children are only unable to "communicate" and she belps them to overcome these difficulties.

Then she will ask the child, "What colors are Queenie's coat?" Her child who was formerly locked in a wall of loneliness will begin to count, "black, gold, etc."

Her children, are contrary to the overly aggressive child of today, problems in reticence and lack of initiative. Mrs. Dolen feels it is her duty to bring a certain amount of spontaneity into their life and begin the business of helping them adjust to society. She enlists the help of the parents and group activities are planned for all of them.

"More troublesome behavior springs from hunger" is aid Mrs. Dolen "then anything else." From this belief she organized the "snack" period in the morning and afternoon. A time when she and her "team" sit down with the children and enjoy crackers and milk, or cereal. Most of the children are insecure, and some of them don't even know their given names. She tries to make them feel proud and confident and give them a sense of importance.

We simply couldn't believe the bright-yed happy children were the same ones who had in the beginning been such behavior problems. The Easter party was a high point in their lives and a community project. Hearing a neighboring kindergarten was having a party they asked Mirs. Dolen if they could have one. She agreed. The mothers saved cottage cheese cartons for the Easter baskets made in class.

On the appointed day, the children resplendent in hats and bow ties they had made themselves took a visit to the kindergarten. This also served the purpose to acquaint the children with the class they would enter in a year or so.

Mrs. Dolen's next project is a trip (with the mothers) to Oakland Hills Farms. Many of the children have never seen a farm and this will be a novelty for them.

We wish there was some way to impart to people how impressed we were with the value of Mrs. Dolen's ideas. Many of these children will be saved from "special education classes" or failure in the school room because of this pre-school attention to their problems. Once they are confronted with the routine of learning, without this preparation, they will be overcome. We feel hopeful that someday, this will be a part of every school program.
