# Farmington Vaulters First To Hit 14-Ft.

An 18-year-old senior at Farmington High School made the big prep sports headlines in Michigan over the weekend.

Ron Shortt, who aspires next fall to enter the University of Michigan, became the first Michigan schoolboy to hit the 14-foot mark in the pole vault when he achieved that exact figure in the Central Relays at Mt. Pleasant.

Shortt soared to the majestic height on his first attempt and thus was able to retain his title in the biggest of Michigan's spring track carnivals.

"Our next goal is 15 feet with Ron and we think he'll get there this year," said his coach Douglas Race who called Shortt's accomplishments in his short pole-vaulting career "simply remarkable."

Race explained.

"Ron has been vaulting only for the second year. And remember how lousy our weather can be around Michigan in the spring. Just look at this year. Wet and cold."

"It's not like out in California or down in Florida or the southwest where a pole vaulter can participate in a year-around outdoor program."

"Our time here in Michigan is short. Ron didn't start vaulting until March 2."

Shortt was engaged in a duel with Fred Rowe of East Detroit High at Mt. Pleasant. Both had cleared 13 feet, six inches despite the bitter cold. Rowe had fewer misses and would have been awarded the victory had not Shortt made 14 feet.

The two preps both asked that the bar be placed at 14. Each wanted to register a Michigan "first."

Shortt went booming down the runway. Up and over! The crowd went wild.

Rowe tried three times. He couldn't connect.

The official state Class A record stands at 13 feet, 11 1/2 inches, and was made two years ago by Wayne Lambert of Saginaw Arthur Hill High.

Shortt will have to wait until the '66 state meet at Ann Arbor to knock out Lambert's record.

But Shortt already has erased his own school record of 13 feet, 9 1/2 inches set earlier this week against Detroit Redford in a dual meet won by Farmington, 57-52.

He has become the most-talked about prep athlete in Michigan.

Track isn't his only sport. Ron made all-conference football honors at Farmington last fall as a half back.

Shortt and Al Phillips of Thurston were the only area entries to win at Mt. Pleasant. Phillips won the high jump with an effort of 6 feet 1 1/2 inches.

Thurston's Chuck Nole ran fifth in the 100-yard dash, Thurston's middle distance relay placed third and Farmington's distance medley relay took fourth.

Chris Brown was the individual point-scoring king for Farmington against Redford as he won the broad jump, 100-yard dash and 220. He was clocked in 10.4 seconds in the "100."

Fritz Simons of the Falcons covered the shot put and low hurdles, while George Habicht triumphed in the high jump and Joe Watson the 440.

Thurston rolled over John Glenn, 92-17, in a dual meet. The Townshippers won every first place against a foe operating minus several of its regulars.

## Franklin Ace Sets Record in '220' Dash

Take a bow, John Saven!

John has developed into the No. 1 track performer at Franklin High School.

He was never more brilliant than against North Farmington in leading Franklin to a 64 1/2-44 1/2 victory in a dual meet.

This was what Saven accomplished against the Raiders.

1—Set a school record of 23.2 seconds in winning the 220-yard dash. Saven had held the Franklin mark of 23.4 seconds.

2—Captured the long jump with a leap of 18 feet, 2 inches.

3—Sped to victory in the 100-yard dash in the fine time of 10.4 seconds.

Another star for Franklin is Dan Ryan, the distance whiz who alternates between the mile, the 880-yard run and the 440-yard dash.

Against North Farmington, Ryan ran the mile in the winning time of 4:35.8, one of the fastest fashioned by a Michigan schoolboy this season. Ryan also anchored the winning Franklin mile relay.

1—Set a school record North Farmington with a victory in the 100-yard dash and also by running a leg on the school's victorious 880-yard relay.

The combination of Larry August, Steve Dube, Tom Ware and Bruce Whetter brought North Farmington victories in the 440 and 880. In the respective times of 44.9 seconds and 1:32.8.

Greg Succop, Robin Murphy, Brian Manning and Jim Rose handled matters for the Raiders in the distance medley with a time of 1:28.2.

Franklin took a second in the 440 and a third in the long jump relays. North Farmington placed second in the pole vault, third in the high jump and shuttle hurdles and fourth in the long jump.
