Life and Auto Insurance Topic for Nankin Mills Extension Group

The Nankin Mills Cooperative Extension Group met at the home of President Mrs. Frank Schips Sr., Garden City.

The Leaders teaching the Lesson about life and Auto Insurance were Mrs. Forest Odell and Mrs. Clyde Love. They informed members there are four basic types of life insurance: straight life, limited payment life, term and endowment plus several combination policies.

Straight life provides permanent protection and cost less annually because the premiums are stretched over the policy holder's life time. Limited payment life concentrates premium payments within a certain period, usually when one is apt to have his highest earnings.

Term insurance has the lowest premiums but offers protection only for the stated term of the policy, usually can be renewed but at a higher premium. Endowments emphasize the steady building up of a specific amount of savings for a given number of years. Combination policies incorporate the features of several policies for specific purposes.

Auto insurance was also discussed and illustrated with visual signs. Insurance was defined as the pooling of money by many people to protect themselves from the risk of high financial losses.
