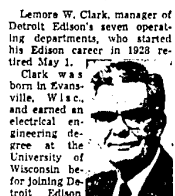


L. W. Clark Retires After 38 Years



Lemore W. Clark, manager of Detroit Edison's seven operating departments, who started his Edison career in 1928 retired May 1.

Clark was born in Evansville, Wis., and earned an electrical engineering degree at the University of Wisconsin before joining Detroit Edison.

His first assignments were in the company's engineering departments and he headed the underground lines department for five years before being assigned duties as the assistant manager of operations in 1933. Since mid-1960 he has had managerial responsibility for the central heating, electrical system, meter, overhead lines, production, stores and transportation, and underground lines departments.

While on loan from Detroit Edison during 1952 and 1953 he served as director of the materials and equipment division of the Defense Electric Power Administration and recently he has completed five and one-half years as deputy director of the local defense electric power area of the Office of Assistant Secretary for Water and Power Development, Department of Interior.

He is a registered professional engineer, a member of the Engineering Society of Detroit, and has taken an active part locally and nationally in the affairs of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, in which he has been a Fellow since 1949. He has also written several papers on welding, arc furnaces and power supply.

Mr. Clark and his wife, Pauline, have three sons—Robert, David and Dr. John Clark, a dentist on active duty with the U. S. Navy—and two grandchildren. The family home is at 30325 W. 12 Mile Rd. in Farmington.
