

May Is Senior Citizens' Month

May has been proclaimed Senior Citizens' Month in the State of Michigan and Monday night the Farmington City Council agreed and issued a similar proclamation in the City.

General theme of the observance is "A New Day for the Older Americans" and local church, fraternal and civic groups are urged to participate by sponsoring an activity for senior citizens or by honoring them in some way.

In the proclamation for the state Governor George Romney points out that:

"The genius of medical science has added many vigorous years to the average lifespan, while modern drugs and new methods of therapy have made it possible to restore the aged sick to health."

"In cooperation with the Federal Government, Michigan is making available to its

communities the funds necessary to establish information and recreation centers for senior citizens and to provide other services they may need.

"Perhaps never before in the history of our country has youth been in greater need of the wisdom and counseling of older people. Much of our present day delinquency could be averted by the timely advice of a senior citizen."

Announce Candidacy

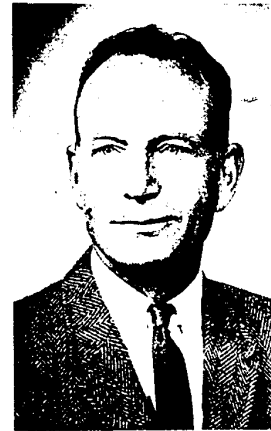

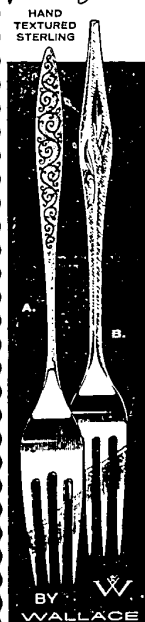
