Temple Beth Am will present on Friday, May 20, following services, the Rev. Ronald Phelps. Rev. Phelps is the Interfaith Chaplain at the Wayne County Training School in Plymouth, and the Protestant Chaplain at the V. A. Hospital in Dearborn.

Topic of his address will be "Working with the Retarded Child." Chaplain Phelps came to this area two years ago, having formerly served as chaplain at the Federal Reformatory in El Reno, Oklahoma.

Rabbi Jack Goldman to Teach at U of D Starting June 27

Rabbi Jack Goldman of 18244 Cherrylawn, Detroit, will teach a course, "Introduction to Biblical Hebrew," at the University of Detroit this summer.

The course will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Monday through Friday starting Monday, June 27. Registration is the week of June 24.

Carrying two credit hours, the course is open to both graduate and undergraduate students.

"The purpose of the course," Rabbi Goldman said, "is to provide a familiarity with the language of the Bible... reading, writing and conversational Hebrew."

He said that Hebrew is both the simplest and most difficult of languages. "It is simple," he said, "because the language has meaning and logic down to the smallest particle; even to the extent that each letter is a picture of an object; and the name of the letter is the name of an object."

"It is difficult because the average American student today is more apt to be familiar with romance and tonal languages with their great overlappings of words and meanings rather than with the semantic languages."

A Missionary Rally, sponsored by the Episcopal Church of the Westside-Convection, including St. Andrew's, Livonia, St. David's, Garden City, St. Elizabeth's, Redford Township; St. John's, Plymouth and St. James, Detroit, will be held on May 24 at the Episcopal Church, Dearborn, at 8 p.m. Tickets—donation: \$1 available at any of the above churches.

This is "Zambia Night" on behalf of our Zambian Project, featuring as guests Mrs. Nancy Williams, and The Most Reverend Oliver Green-Wilkinson, Archbishop of Central Africa and Bishop of Zambia. The Bishop who is currently a visitor in the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, says he "hopes to work himself out of a job."

This refers to his program of bringing native clergy in the four dioceses of his Archdiocese—Zambia, Malawi, Mashonaland and Matabeleland.

Two outstanding leaders in Zambia are native suffragan Bishop Philip Malaka, who was appointed in 1964, and Archbishop Mulenga, who serves on Zambia's Copperbelt. Bishop's Lodge, a provincial seminary which opened in the month Archbishop Green-Wilkinson arrived in Lusaka in 1962, now has 23 students and soon will have 30.

The Archbishop sees evangelism as the most important part of his work. "As an evangelist," he says, "there are three things one must do; first one must talk to people, ask people and answer them. Secondly, one must keep periods of private prayer and silence each day; and thirdly one must keep up one's reading. If you do these three things, there is a fair chance that you will be able to preach in a way that is not unrelated to people's thinking and will have renewed the truths that are contained in the faith."

After 15 years of heavy responsibilities and long weeks of seven days each, Archbishop Green-Wilkinson shows little of the strain. He is a man of great energy, and is known for his virtues of leadership, courage and decision, and administrative ability. His charge includes about 250 priests and missionaries and a far greater number of catechists and lay workers.

Oliver Green-Wilkinson was ordained Deacon in 1946, following service in World War II, and was priest in 1947. He was curate of St. Mary in Southampton from 1946 to 1950, then returned to the Diocese of Pretoria, where he had worked as a layman in 1956. After only 15 months in South Africa, he was elected Bishop and returned to Lusaka, Zambia. Ten years later he was elected to the Archbishopric of Central Africa.
