The Fisher Theater promises a lively month of variety entertainment in the form of Miss Gayer, Abner May, and the Northland Playhouse opens its doors with a pre-Broadway comedy, "Goodbye, Crib," featuring June Allyson.

Tirrell Warns of Loss in State Aid to College

Current programs and plans for expansion of Oakland Community College will face curtailment in the amount of \$1,005,402 (detailed attached) if state support is limited to the appropriation presently pending in the Legislature. OCC President John E. Tirrell has reported to the Board of Trustees.

The Michigan Community Colleges have requested State Aid in the amount of \$500 per full-time student and \$B 1255, which has been passed by the Senate and is presently in the House Ways and Means Committee, provided for \$325 per full-time transfer student and \$350 per full-time technical/vocational student, Tirrell said.

"It is especially disconcerting," Tirrell reported, "that, although the Legislature can see fit to appropriate \$16,700,000 to the 25 public community colleges, it is seriously considering a Bill (S.B. 749) to provide some \$4,000,000 for assistance to students who will attend private and parochial institutions of higher learning."

"Historically, a cornerstone of this nation's strength and independence has been the establishment and expansion of a public school system available for all."

"Oakland Community College was created by the citizens of Oakland County who voted under state statute to provide for its youth and adults—in the public institution—low cost, high quality educational opportunities so that they might best prepare themselves for useful and rewarding lives."

"Twenty-four other County Districts have similarly voted the establishment of public community colleges in their areas."

"For more than 100 years the State assumed the responsibility for assisting the public institutions of higher learning."
