17-Year-Old
Swim Victim

What started out to be a pleasant warm Sunday afternoon pastime of fishing turned into tragedy over the weekend when a 17-year-old Farmington Township youth dived in the pond at 11 Mile and Halsted Rds.

Dead is Arthur Francis Leland III, of 2811 Reselear, a sophomore at Clarenceville High School. He is the son of Mrs. Arthur F. Leland III of Farmington Township and Arthur F. Leland III of Highland Park.

A resident of Farmington for 13 years, he attended Edgewood Grade School and was a member of the Clarenceville Basketball and Baseball Teams and the school choir. He was nicknamed "Landy" by his classmates.

Evidently Leland and his companions tired of fishing and decided to swim across the pond which is about 200 feet wide. He evidently slipped and fell into the water.

Rescue workers from the Sheriff's Office recovered the body about an hour and a half after the incident. It was in about 28 feet of water.

Rena Spears of 28710 Ravenwood, Farmington, was standing on the East shore of the pond and saw the boy go under the water. She ran to Halsted Rd. and stopped a passing car asking the driver to call the police. Edward Cole Jr., of 261 S. Francis, Farmington Township, a swimming companion, tried to help Leland, but gave up after he was pulled under the water twice.

A Requiem Mass will be said Wednesday morning at St. Alexander's Church, a Catholic Church in Farmington. Burial will be Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. The Healy-Sundquist Funeral Home handled the arrangements.

In addition to his parents, Leland is survived by six brothers and sisters, 13 aunts and uncles, 13 Sisters, Rosemarie and David. Also surviving are his grandparents: Mr. and Mrs. Arthur F. Leland of Farmington and Mr. and Mrs. Bonnie Boyd of Caruthersville, Missouri.
