

UF Reduces Number of It's Agencies

Wendell W. Anderson Jr., president of the United Foundation, announced that 12 UF agencies had been either merged or discontinued.

As a result, Anderson said, the Torch Drive will campaign for fewer agencies in 1966 than in 1965. This, he said, is the first time the

the United Foundation, the compelling reason to bind each merger and agency discontinuance, Anderson said.

"In certain cases we found that there was some duplication of service, in other cases we simply eliminated the need for separate facilities and administrative expense.

"This move further points up the determination of the officers and staff of the United Foundation to constantly guard against any waste of Torch Drive contributions. "I believe the contributors of our community deserve the finest administration possible and we are dedicated to giving it to them." Anderson also announced the addition of one new agency, the Lutheran Home for Girls, at 665 E. Grand Blvd. The home is for teenage girls

who can be helped by supervised living away from their homes. It is budgeted through the United Community Services (UCS), Anderson said. Support is being discontinued at the Richmond Recreation Board, the South Dearborn Heights Recreation Center and the Mary Hulbert House, at 553 E. Grand. The first two are recreational programs in the suburbs; the latter was a temporary supervised home for young women

released from the Lafayette Clinic. Anderson said other Torch

Drive agencies would continue to provide the services of each.

Also discontinued was the Metropolitan Detroit Police Foundation, which was headquartered in the UF Building at 1528 Woodward. The foundation, which was established originally to care for police victims at Herman Kiefer Hospital, made grants to agencies such as the Rehabilitation Institute and the Visiting Nurse Association. In the future such grants will be made direct, Anderson said.

Ask Boys Register For Loops

Although in the midst of the summer baseball program, the Livonia Junior Football League will begin taking registrations for the fall grid squads from July 11 through July 31.

Going into the 10th season, the league is geared to take care of youngsters from the ages of nine through 13. The circuit sponsors five units, composed of 105 boys each. Each unit has three teams including: freshman, ages 9 and 10, weighing between 65 and 105 pounds; junior varsity for boys, ages 10 and 11, weighing 65 to 105 pounds; and varsity, for those between the ages of 11 and 12, weighing between 85 and 120 pounds.

Boys must be nine or older before Sept. 1 and not more than 12 on Sept. 1.

The boys are placed on a first come—first served basis and assigned to a team in a geographic location near home.

Opponents this year will come from Garden City, Westland, Dearborn and Plymouth with games on Saturday evenings or Sunday afternoon.

Boys interested and who qualify may pick up a pre-addressed, stamped registration card at the Livonia Parks and Recreation Dept. office, 14365 Farmington Road, any day between July 11 and 13.

Physicals are required and are given by teams. After all registrations are in, a family night will be scheduled to describe the program in detail to boys and parents.
