Appeals Decision On Rights

A Farmington resident's appeal from a drunk driving conviction in Redford Township is expected to shed more light on recent court interpretations of citizens' rights when arrested.

Phillip M. Madigan, 24, of 24843 Ivywood, Farmington, posted a \$100 appeal bond June 28 in Redford Township Justice Court where he was found guilty of driving while under the influence of alcohol and fined \$100.

Despite a claim by Madigan's attorney, Alvin C. Ingle, former Farmington Township Justice of the Peace for 12 years who did not seek re-election last year, that the defendant was denied legal protection, Redford Justice John M. Dillon ruled otherwise. "I held that he had been advised," Dillon said.

The J.P. explained that the defendant replied to Patrolman George Murphy when asked if he wanted to take a blood test: "I refuse to take that or any kind of test."

"The defense claimed he should have been asked, also, about taking other tests," Dillon continued. "But I felt Madigan's statement was sufficient to indicate he would not take any tests."

Ingle said he was the first attorney to take an alcohol blood test appeal to the Michigan Supreme Court, in which a decision was made in favor of the defendant in "The People vs. Reedner."

The decision handed on Reedner's not being revised of his rights to have a blood test and was handed down June 3, 1963.

AFS Students Schedule 3-Day Farmington Visit

Thirty-nine American day they will tour either Field Service students representing 25 countries will visit Farmington during the weekend of July 9 to 12. The AFS chapters at North Farmington and Farmington High Schools will serve as hosts to the students and their chaperons.

The students have spent the past year attending high schools in New York State and are currently on a three week tour of the United States. They will end the tour in Washington where they will meet President Johnson.

From Washington the students go to the final meeting of all the AFS students to evaluate their year and then return to their homeland.

While in Farmington the students will be entertained by 40 host families. On Sunday they will visit the Downtown Detroit or Cranbrook School and Museum.

City Manager John Dinan will welcome the students to Farmington on Monday morning at the Farmington City Hall. Following this ceremony the group will visit the Municipal Court and have a picnic lunch on the lawn of the Masonic Lodge.

In the afternoon they will tour the Ford Rouge Plant. On Tuesday the guests will depart to continue their tour.

Farmington has been active in the AFS Scholarship Program since 1956. In 1963 a second chapter was chartered at North Farmington High. During the past year two students, Monica Raefacelli from Argentina and Erwin Furlan from Guatemala lived in the community.

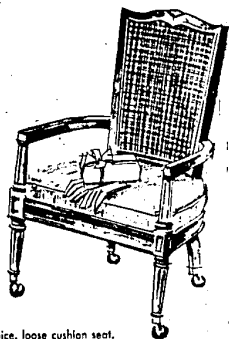
