Van Cliburn To Be Soloist at Meadow Brook July 14-15

Van Cliburn, the tall Texas pianist whose exploits dazzle the music world, will appear as soloist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at Oakland University's Meadow Brook Festival Thursday, Friday, and Saturday at 8:30 p.m. and next Sunday at 8:30 p.m. Robert Shaw will conduct while Sixten Ehrling guest conducts at Ravinia in Chicago this week.

Cliburn will play the Beethoven Concerto No. 5 ("Emperor") Thursday and Friday on a program which will include Mozart's Overture to "The Magic Flute," Hindemith's Symphonic Metamorphosis on Themes by Weber, and Tchaikovsky's Overture-Fantasy, "Romeo and Juliet."

On Saturday and Sunday Cliburn will play the Tchaikovsky Concerto No. 1, in B flat minor, on a program which will include Schubert's Symphony No. 3 in D Major, and Hindemith's Symphony "Mathis der Maler."
