Area Drivers May Go To Livonia for Permits

Motorists in the Plymouth area may have to go all the way to a central office of the Secretary of State in Livonia to get driver's licenses if Secretary of State James Hare gets approval for plans developed in Western Wayne County Mayors and Supervisors at a noon luncheon Monday.

The meeting was called to get views of the mayors and supervisors on how the Michigan Department of State can best provide driver's licenses services to citizens of the areas affected when the Sheriff's office goes out of business.

Inasmuch as there is a distinct possibility that the Livonia Police Department also will get out of the business, Hare says, a central office in Livonia

that could take care of residents in Livonia, Plymouth, Northville and part of Redford Township.

The proposal calls for the Michigan Department of State to staff and maintain the office.

Hare emphasized that the plans were still in the talking stage but that a decision will be made soon since the Sheriff's Department will be out of business within a short time.

State operated examining stations have been issuing all licenses in the City of Detroit since the first of the year.

Within the past few weeks the first State station was opened in Oakland County. There are two stations operating in Macomb County.

Although the plans are still rather sketchy, Hare indicated that the State will probably locate two stations in the area.

Lawyer Seeks Nomination As City Judge

Evan Callanan, Garden City lawyer campaigning for a municipal judge nomination in the August primary election, has proposed a night court and an improved probation department.

The candidate also stressed that qualifications of a judge and said that a judge "must be learned in the law, not merely the law from books but the law as it is applied in action in the courtroom. A trial judge must, of necessity, have trial experience. My extensive experience as prosecutor and defense attorney makes me the best qualified and most experienced candidate," he claimed.

Callanan also said that he was appointed City Attorney in 1960 and, assigned two years later over the Moeller Drain controversy.

On night court, the candidate said that it would "give a citizen an opportunity to defend his position without the loss of wages or employment."

Concerning the probation department, the candidate said that the department can be improved by a personal review of all probationers on a monthly basis.

School Board Informed of Programs

The Garden City Board of Education was brought up to date last week in two training programs for adults paid for entirely by the U. S. Dept. of Labor.

Both programs, which had all of its 22 enrollees placed in private employment, have small amounts yet to be reimbursed to the school district.

One program had 10 adults complete the 52-week course in auto mechanics, after a need for such skills was determined by the Michigan Employment Security Commission.

Of the \$29,922 budgeted for the program, held at the auto shop department at East High School, only \$7,905.08 hasn't yet been reimbursed to the school district.

The other class, a full-year course in meta machines, had 12 enrollees with all but \$2,513.17 of the cost of \$23,064 reimbursed.
