QUEEN OF HEARTS MOUNT BLANC

Slice into three even layers. Lengthwise, 1/2 gallon French vanilla ice cream. Place separate layers on wax paper on a cookie sheet. Return to freezer. Hurry now, and slice into servings, placing each slice on a chilled plate. Serve with Caramel Sauce, which is simply made by stirring together over hot water: 1/2 pound caramel, 1 cup rich cream or evaporated milk. Cool before using.

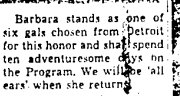
