### Beware of High Blood Pressure

High blood pressure, more properly called arterial hypertension, is an abnormal state of the circulation that may be a cause as well as a result of arterial disease, says a pamphlet from the American Medical Association called "Your Blood Pressure".

Four of every five cases of persistently in or e a set of blood pressure are known as primary or essential hypertension, for which no underlying cause can be identified, asys the AMA publication. It often occurs in those with a family history of increased blood pressure.

The other one-fifth of the cases are called secondary hypertension, which means that the cause is known to be some defect or disease.

The patient and his doctor, working iogather, plan a living patiern, supplement-ed by various medical pro-cedures, that will result in the longest and most useful life that the patient can live, even though the doctor may never know the cause of his patient's hy-pertension.

In untreated hypertension, the course from onset to death is approximately 20 years. The first two-thirds is without symptoms, and can go undiscovered unless the patient undergoes periodic health examinations, particularly in the middle years.

average survival of the untreated patient is about
